**REVIEW AND ACT:**

**Monday, November 13, 2017 Work and Regular Session Meeting Minutes:**

**OLD BUSINESS:**

Pearce Creek Update. 89 people have been hooked up to water at this time. Hang tags have started to be put out for the well abatements, but none have been scheduled at this time. Scheduling abatements will need to be discussed at the Pearce Creek meeting on Friday. Total of 225 homes will be hooked up in Pearce Creek and there are 2 new constructions going up. New constructions will pay for hook up since they do not have a pre-existing well.

Cecil Transit. Those who have signed up to ride on the 12<sup>th</sup>, received their reminder phone call. Mayor Zang and Town Administrator Cooper will be riding on this first trip. Many citizens have registered, however, the Lower Cecil County Seniors Group have their winter luncheon on the 12<sup>th</sup>. Therefore, the number of residents signed up to ride may be low. This is going to provide transportation for several citizens that do not have it on their own. Rides will always be on Tuesdays and this does conflict with the Lower Cecil County Seniors group and their meetings, but that was the best day Cecil Transit could give us at this time. Mayor Zang and Administrator Cooper expressed they are looking forward to it. Transit will be coming twice a month, second and fourth Tuesday of the month.

Cecilton Activity Report

Mayor and Council reviewed the report. Mayor Zang noticed that some of the reports are being sent with 2 months combined rather than individual months. The report is compiled from information provided by Deputy Walmsley.


