The Mayor and Council held a Work and Regular Session Meeting in Town Hall on Monday April 9, 2018. The following were in attendance:

**REVIEW AND ACT:**

**Tuesday, March 27, 2018 Mayor and Council Work and Regular Session Meeting Minutes:**

Member Zack made a motion to accept the Tuesday, March 27, 2018 Work and Regular Session Meeting Minutes as written. Member Cooper seconded the motion. The motion carried.

**March Preliminary Financials and Account Balances:**

March Preliminary Financials were presented and no questions were asked.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

Cecilton Detail Report for April was reviewed and discussed.

Cecilton March Activity Report was reviewed and discussed. A request will be made for Deputy Walmsley to end the next meeting.

Cecil County Overdose Prevention: Mike Missouli from the Cecil County Health Department attended instead of Roberta Johnson. Training is offered for Narcan and provision of Narcan for anyone in the community, as well as information for families is available every night at 6:00 pm at the Health Department. This training can be offered wherever needed in the community. Mr. Missouli provided disposal bags for unused medications and informational handouts about addiction, recovery, disposing/handling of medications, and education. Mr. Missouli also reviewed services that the Health Department can offer such as outpatient treatment for addiction, walk-in screening assessments and referrals and recovery support.

Oath of Office - Krystal Ringgold was sworn in as an election judge.

Cecilton Volunteer Fire Company Music Festival. Kaite Paolantonio came on behalf of Deanna Cheyney, CVFC President. Cheyney's idea is to bring big events to small towns. If 200 tickets are sold to the Music Festival, then there will be a profit of \$27,000 for the fire company. Early bird tickets will sell for \$30 in the first two months prior to the event and \$40 at the door. Food and raffles will be available and open vendor spots for \$25. They only have 4 sponsors currently, but have received donations from town residents. Mayor Zang asked about the benefits of being a sponsor. Sponsor will have a banner with their name on it at the event and they can take it home afterwards. The sponsor's name will also be listed on the Fire Proof t-shirt. The hope is that the sponsorships will cover the music and stage rental. This event will start at 1pm and bands will play at 2pm. Event will end at 1:45 am. Administrator Cooper expressed that this will be the biggest event for CVFC and in the past Mayor and Council has given a large donation towards the fireworks. If there is not going to be fireworks this year, then maybe that donation could be given towards the festival. Gabby Barrett, contestant on

American Idol, is booked as the main event. Administrator Cooper expressed that a lot of work has gone into this project already and that the Town should consider being the largest supporter. Mayor Zang expressed that the town will support the event, but the amount will be determined at a later date. Promotion will also be on Cecilton Town website and Facebook page.

Quarterly meeting of the Cecil/Harford Chapter of Maryland Municipal League will be April 19<sup>th</sup> in Rising Sun. Mayor Zang and wife, Carrie, will be attending.

Pack the Pew Service at the Union Bethel AME Church at 11:00 am on April 15<sup>th</sup>. Mayor, Council, and Staff are invited. Flowers will be sent for the service.

Storm Water Concerns on Center Street. Images were reviewed of flooding problems after an average rain. There is a drain there, but the swale is filled in. Easements will be needed from all residents near the drain to access their property to recreate the swale. Attorney Thomas Yeager will need to be contacted as the first step.

Earth Day Activity Ideas. The Town does not have an official Earth Day (4/22/2018) Activity this year. Proposed activity will be working with the Boy Scouts to spread mulch at the park playground. Sue Katzmire will identify a date that the Boy Scout Troop can do this activity.

Member Zack expressed that the trees in Frisby's Meadow on Ariel Avenue need to be trimmed.
