Mayor and Council Regular Session Meeting Tuesday, May 29, 2018

The Mayor and Council held a Regular Session Meeting in Town Hall on Tuesday May 29, 2018. The following were in attendance:

REVIEW AND ACT:

Monday May 14, 2018 Mayor and Council Work Session Meeting Minutes:

Member Cooper made a motion to accept the Monday, May 14, 2018 Work Session Meeting Minutes as written. Member Brockell seconded the motion. The motion carried.

April Final Financials and Account Balances:

April Final Financials were presented. Mayor Zang asked a question about the general fund checking amount. Member Zack motioned to accept the April Final Financials and Account Balances as written. Member Brockell seconded the motion. The motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

DMR Report for April was discussed and there were no questions.

Delmarva Summer Energy Report provided an understanding of what Delmarva is doing to manage the power grid this time of year as well as how citizens can weather storms and conserve energy and costs.

Cecilton Activity Report for May was discussed. Discussion of deputy volunteers to sign up for the extra hours of duty for patrol. Additional concerns was the long response time to calls from citizens. Administrator Cooper will contact the North East State Police Barrick Commander about a meeting to discuss response time and the possibility of receiving a monthly activity report.

Sit and Stay Bench Campaign. Administrator Cooper explained that the idea behind the Sit and Stay Bench Campaign was to provide places where visitors and residents can sit to enjoy the community. Organizations, families, individuals, and businesses can purchase a bench to be erected in honor or memory of someone of their choice. A gentlemen that has done business with the Town commented that he loved the idea, enjoys the Town of Cecilton, and would like to see people sitting about and enjoying the Town. He wanted to donate the first bench anonymously and have it be go to someone special in the community. Town Staff immediately thought of Miss Becky due to her being our oldest resident and a lifetime resident. It was decided that this bench should be placed at Cecilton Elementary School since she is a retired Cecil County Public School Educator. The kickoff will be on Thursday, June 7 at 10:30 am. The bench will be placed at the crosswalk in the driveway of the school. After the kickoff, there will be light refreshments at the Community Center. The campaign will be explained at this time to attendees. Information will also be provided to the churches and

community organizations. Cecil County Council Members, Cecil County School Board, Rising Herald, Cecil Guardian, Cecil Whig, Cecil County Public School Administration, and Mayor and Council Members as well as other community members have been invited to the kickoff event.

Budget for Fiscal Year 2019 –

Enterprise Budget was reviewed line by line. Differences were noted between 2019 and current budget due to The Pearce Creek project being finished. Budget line item 5192 contained a misspelling.

Mayor Zang question whether all the money from the water line project administration allocation has been used. Administrator Cooper replied that we are still using it because the project is still not complete.

General Budget was reviewed line by line. Budget line item 4250 (mosquito and weed control) was discussed.

Mayor and Council will review the standing budget after the first quarter ending in October 2018.

The State Highway Administration plan to slow traffic on Route 213 was reviewed. There will striping to create parking places and create brick entrance ways into driveways. They have seen a lot of success with traffic with these visual guidelines. At this time there is not plan for Route 282. Discussion continued on the need for traffic to be slowed on Route 282. Working on trying to get a camera from the state that would be able count and take pictures to identify traffic pattern and speed. This is a long process. Mayor Zang emphasized how important it is to call dispatch and report vehicles speeding.


