REVIEW AND ACT:

Tuesday, February 19, 2019 Mayor and Council Work and Regular Session Meeting Minutes:

Member DeVary made a motion to accept the Tuesday, February 19, 2019 Work and Regular Session Meeting Minutes as written. Member Zack seconded the motion. The motion carried.

February Preliminary Financials and Account Balances:

February Preliminary Financials and Account Balances were presented. No questions for report.

NEW BUSINESS:

Cecil County Sheriff Department Contract: Contract tabled until the next meeting when Mayor Zang and Administrator Cooper can be present.

The ARC: Administrator Cooper was not able to be present to discuss this.

January DMR Report was reviewed. No questions at this time.

Earth Day: Veterans' Bench and Flagpole Dedication as well as the final cemetery cleanup for the Union Bethel AME Church Cemetery on Water Street will be at 10:00 am on Monday, April 22, 2019. Chesapeake City VFW will be participating in the dedication.

Summer Camp: Dates will July 22nd to July 26th from 9am to 3pm. Limited to 15 children.

ALICE Training: March 7th. Town Hall will close for the afternoon and all 3 Town Hall staff members will be trained. Tracey Miller, Cecilton Library Manager, commented that she has been through the training and it was good but intense. Training will teach you what to do during an active shooter situation.

Jail and Bail: Thursday, March 14th at 4 pm at Elk River Brewing Company. All funds will benefit our Friends of Cecil County Victim Memorial Services and their efforts to erect a permanent homicide memorial. Administrator Cooper is one of the participants that will be "locked up" and she will be requesting donations to get out of "jail". Her goal is \$500.

OLD BUSINESS:

Fluorination of Water: Administrator Cooper met with Dr. Bruce Obenshein. At this point, we will not be fluorinating the water. With all the information she was able to gather, it is very cost prohibitive, the plant was not set up for it when it was designed and constructed. There has been concern with some Earleville residents that they have medical conditions where they can't have fluoride. Opinions from Maryland Rural Water, George Smith, operator for Perryville, and AECOM were to not do it.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:


Public Comments:
