The Mayor and Council held a Regular Session Meeting in Town Hall on Monday, December 15, 2025. The following were in attendance:

Meeting was called to order at 7:02 pm.  
All in attendance recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Review and Act:**

**November 17, 2025 Regular Session Meeting Minutes:** Member Wise motioned to accept the November 17, 2025 Regular Session Meeting Minutes as written. Member Katzmire seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**November Final Financials:** Member Katzmire motioned to accept the October Final Financials. Member Wise seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

**WTTP and Water Supply Report:** Jordan Smith and Heather Perry were present to review the report. Normal operations were conducted. Had septic hauler clean wastewater treatment plant influent wet-well. Both plants were in full compliance.

**Cecilton Activity Report:** Corporal Dix was present to review activity. Successful month with traffic stops. Identified and arrest on a suspicious vehicle on a DUI. Corporal Dix and Deputies were part of the Holiday Tractor Parade. Corporal Dix commented that the Town does a great job on events. Administrator Cooper commented that it was nice for the residents to see the partnership between the Sheriff's office and the Town. Thank you for your participation. Member Katzmire thanked the Sheriff's Department for the movie night. Current patrols are usually Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. During the week they try to have hours during the arrival and dismissal of school. Corporal Dix will work on getting some additional patrol during arrival and dismissal times. Updated Corporal Dix on a concern of a resident (renter) making threats on social media.

**Winter Coverage:** Normally we cut back on some of the hours of coverage by the Cecil County Sheriff's Office for the months of December, January, and February (sometimes March). Have been trying to send a message on speeding as people are coming into town. Normally cut back because it is a slower time of year. Proposal of shifting hours during school hours. Administrator Cooper will discuss with Corporal Dix about options. Member Wise commented that a deputy did go through the senior center to show residents picture of a person of concern that residents can be on a look out for them.

**New Bank Account:** Received letter from People's Bank that they are merging with a federal credit union. You cannot have a municipal account with a credit union. People's Bank did find a bank to service our loan so we do not have to find a bank to refinance. However, we do need to find a bank to hold our accounts. It looks like PNC Bank in Middletown since that is the closest to town. Administrator and Treasurer will be going to PNC on Tuesday to get the accounts set up. Mayor and Council agreed with the switch.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

Member Katzmire asked if there had been any new information on the land behind the senior Village. Have not heard anything more. In the past, there has been several people interested in doing something with that parcel but nothing has come of it. There is a for sale sign in the middle of the property.

Member Wise motioned to adjourn the meeting. Member Katzmire seconded the motion.


